

Draw a Landscape with Flowers- Grades K-12



This drawing teaches students how to prepare and execute a drawing using a simple Visual Art concept as a basis. Students begin with pencil then progress to color. Encourage student to identify the Horizon Line outdoors, if possible, or in a picture. Also, student encourage student to draw the flowers of their choice.

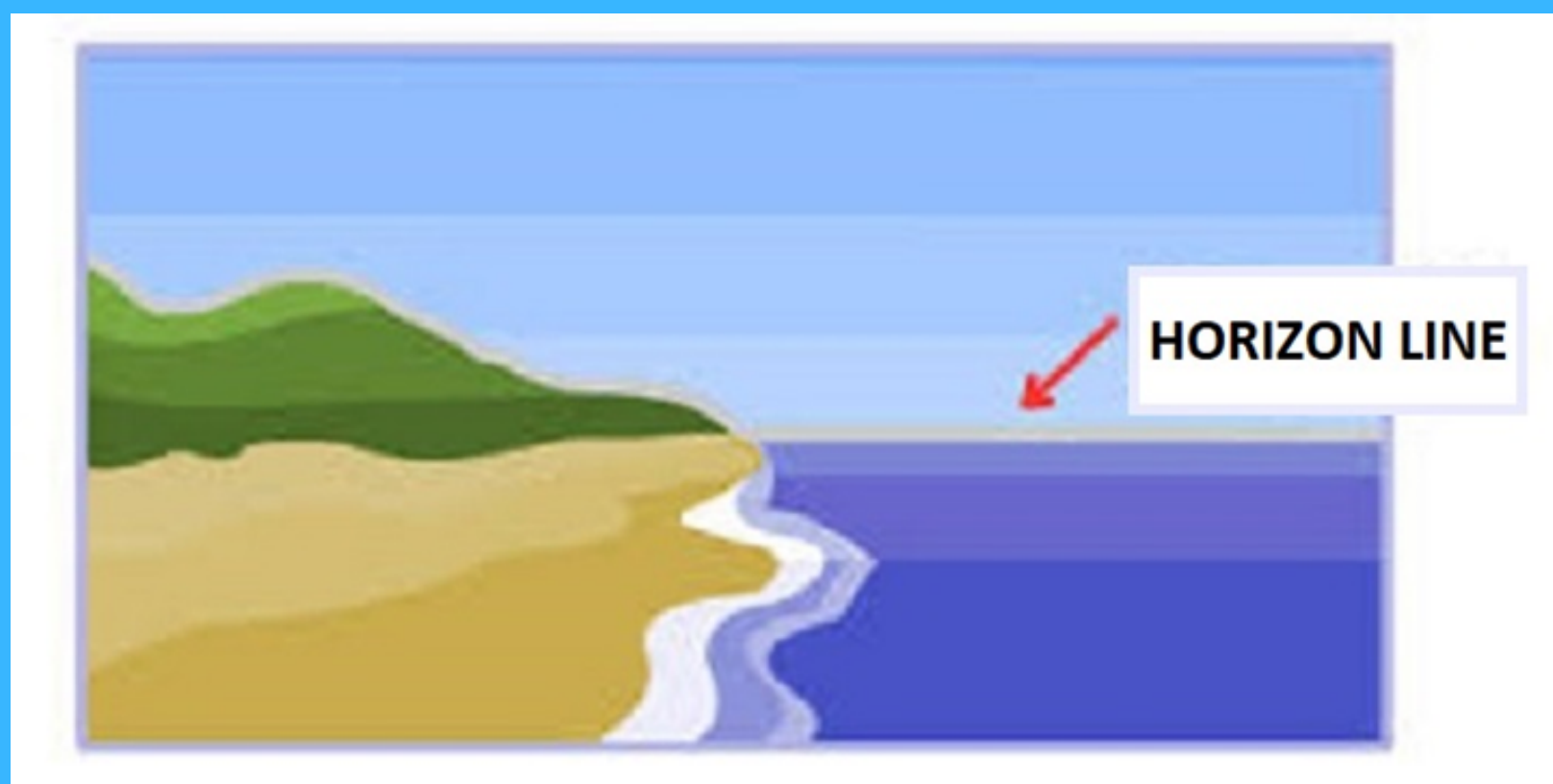
WHAT YOU NEED:

Ruler, Pencils, Paper, Colored pencils, or crayons or pastels or markers

Let's mix a Visual Art concept before we begin drawing. This drawing will use a HORIZON LINE.

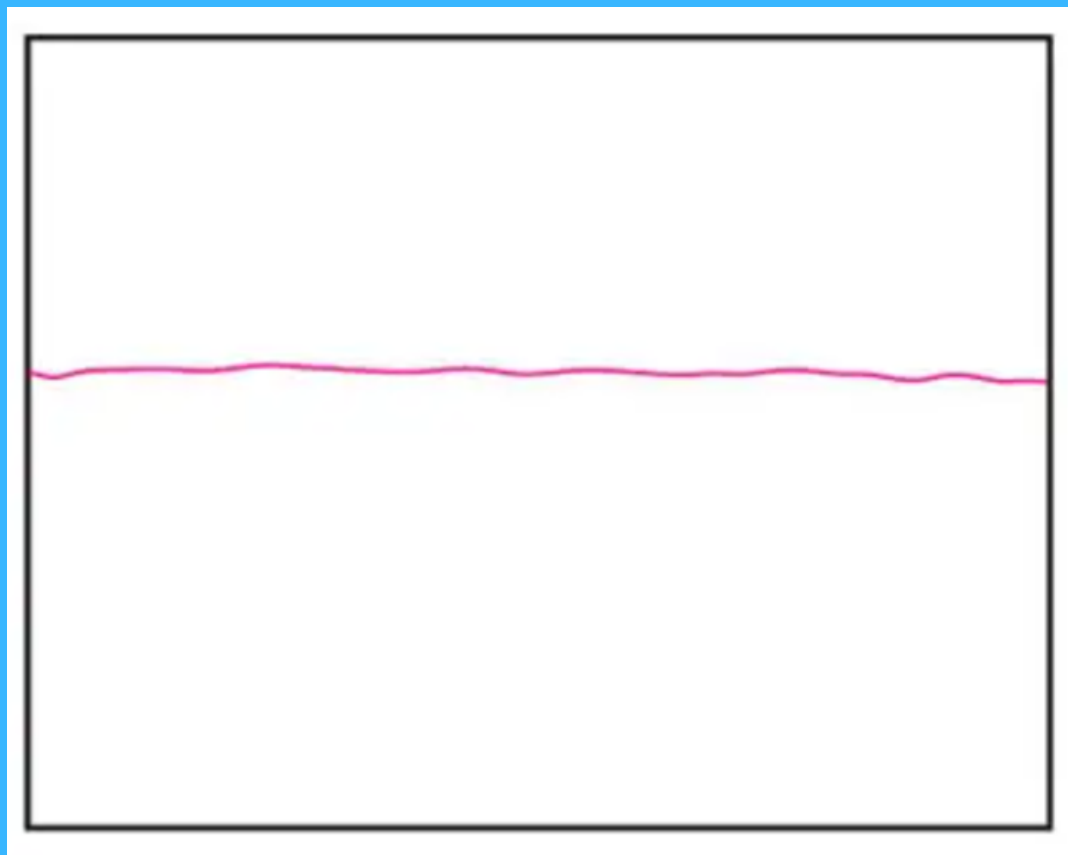
What is the HORIZON LINE?

The horizon line is the place where the earth meets the sky.

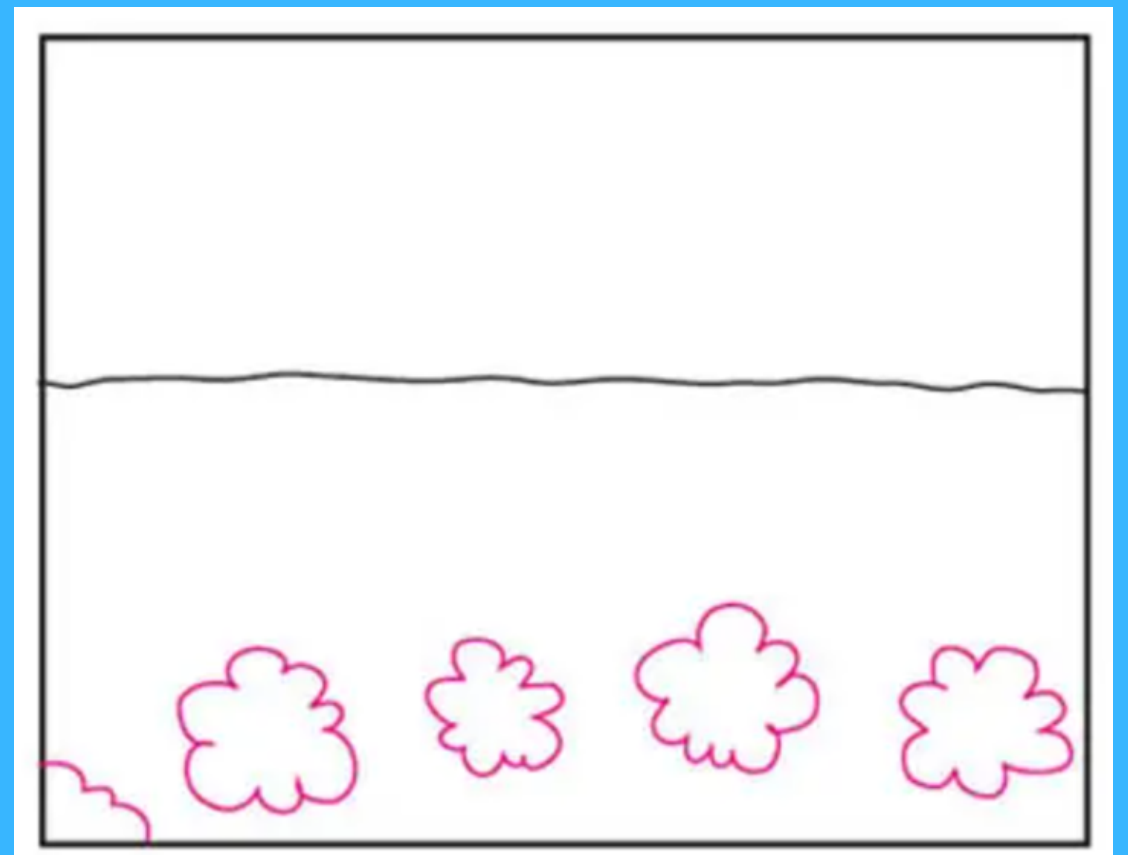


Good! Let's use a Horizon Line.

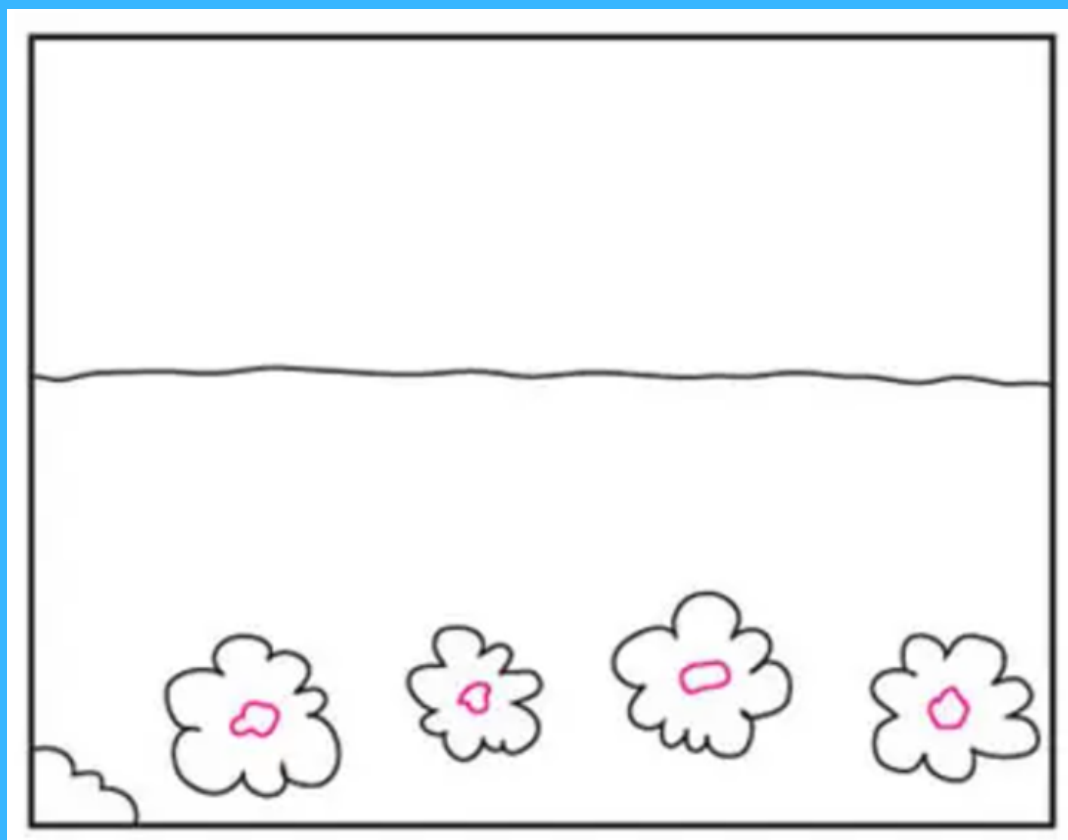
1. Draw a horizon line.



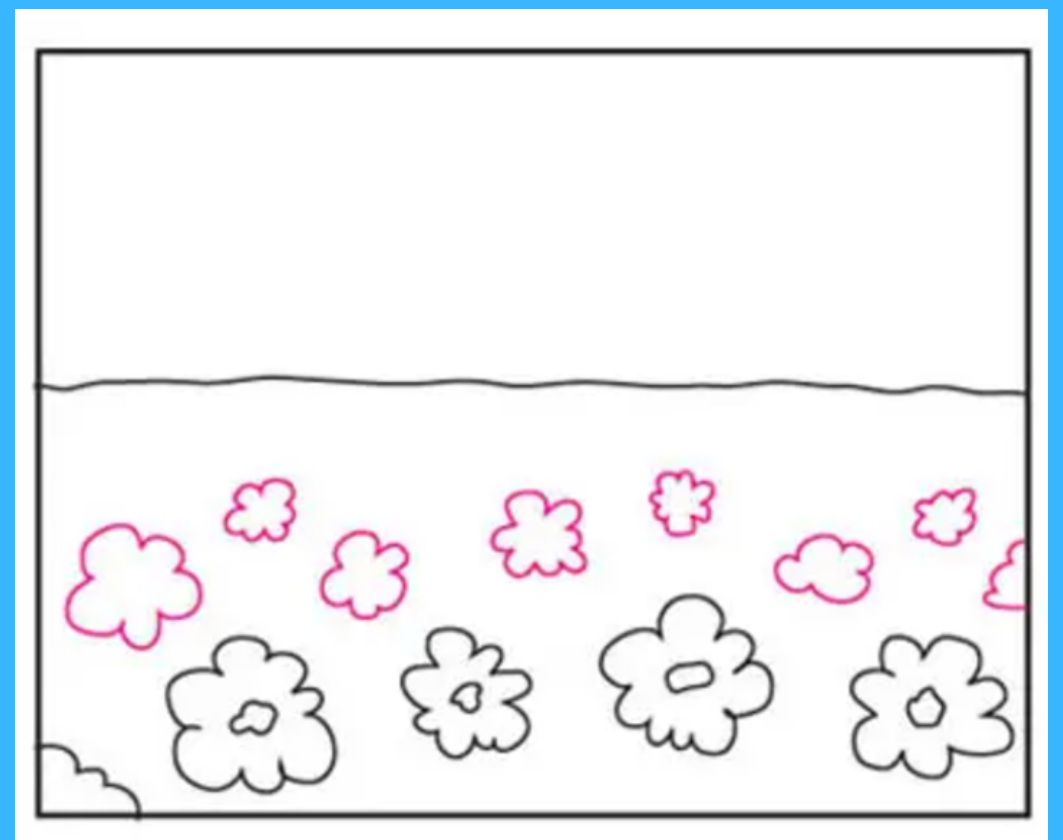
2. Draw a row of large flowers near the bottom.



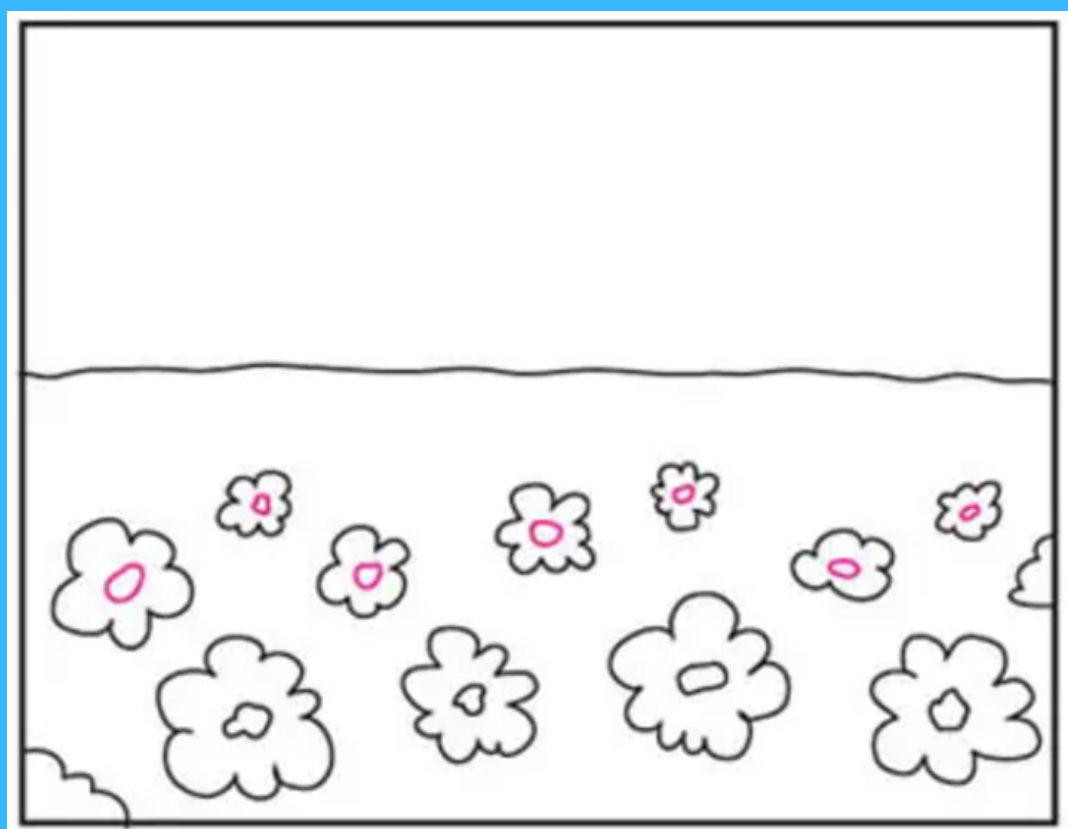
3. Add centers to the flowers.



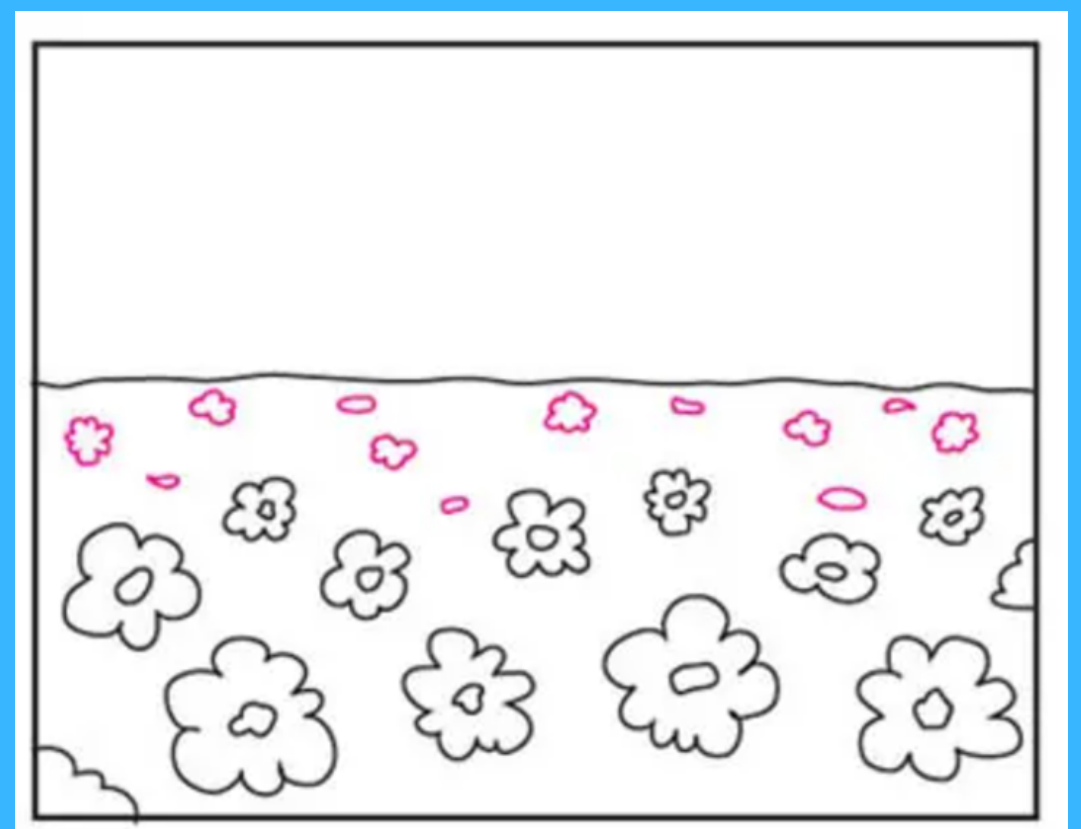
4. Draw a row of medium flowers.



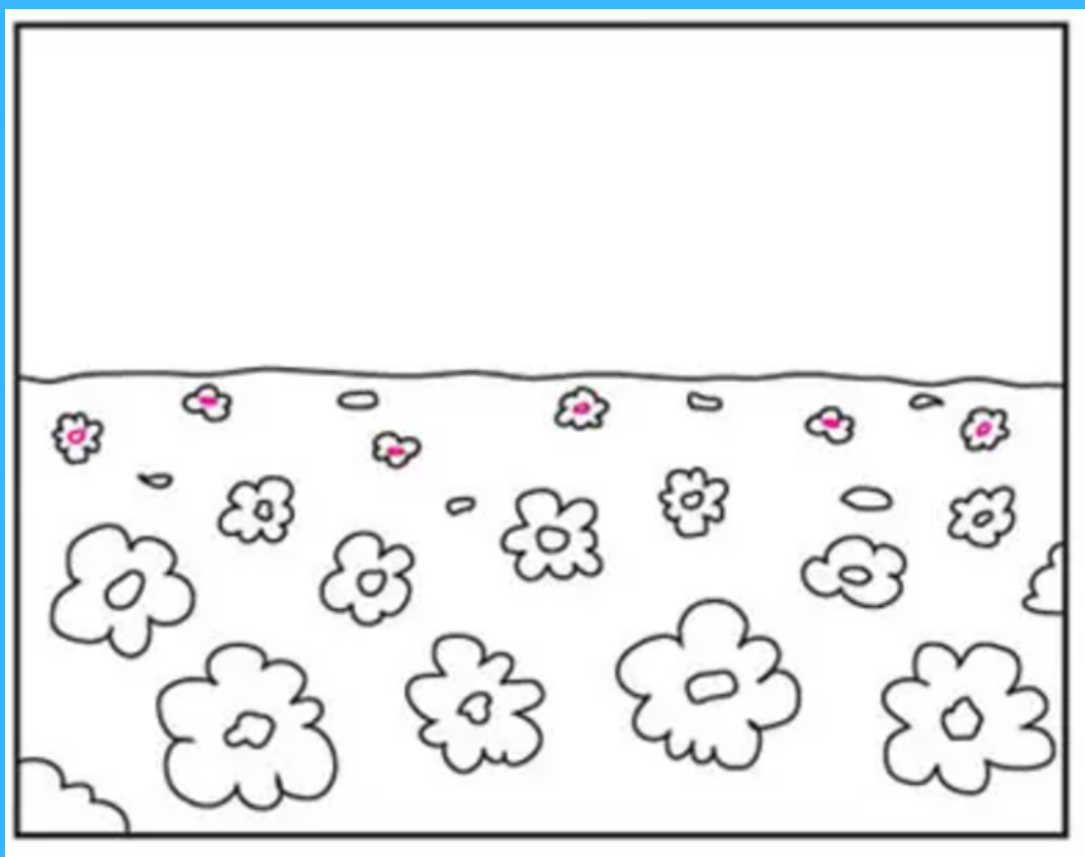
5. Add centers to the flowers.



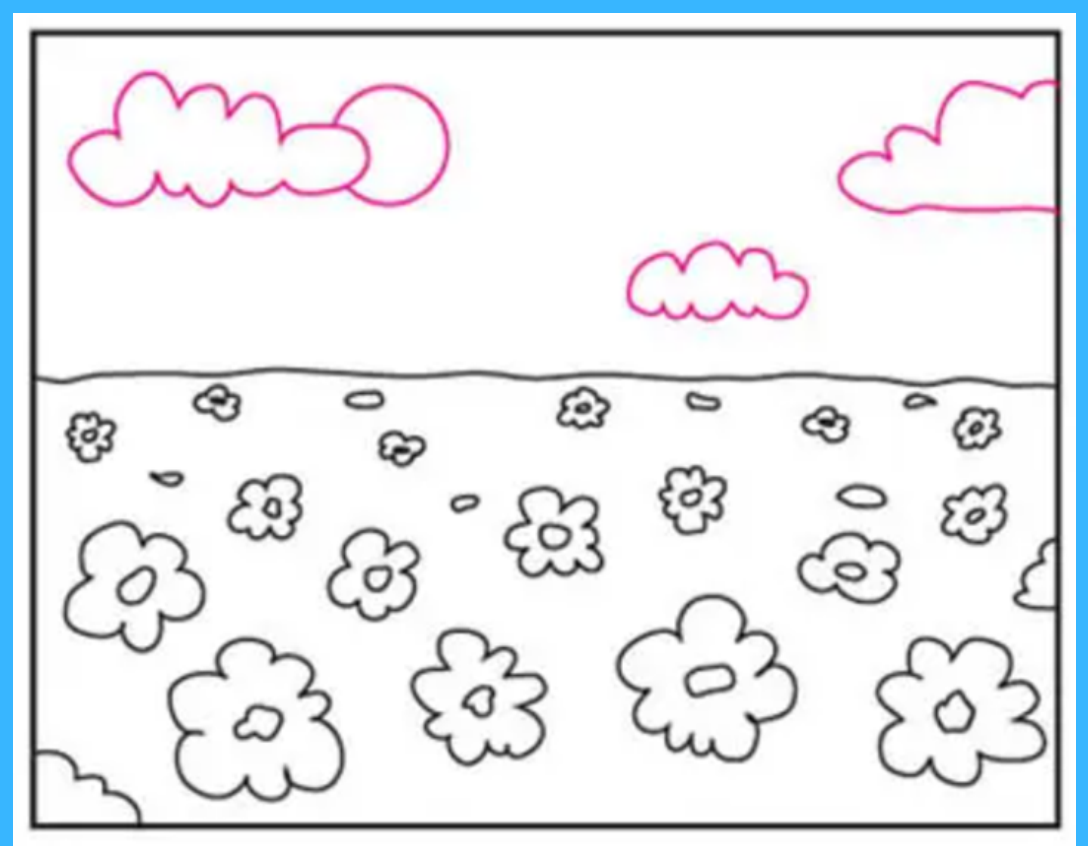
6. Fill in the rest with smaller flowers.



7. Add centers to some of the flowers.



8. Finish the sky with clouds and a sun.



9. Trace with marker and color.
