

Easy Easter Eggs – Grades 1-4

Supplies: Pencil, Eraser, 2 pieces of scrap paper and 1 piece of nice white paper, 1 black sharpie, Colored pencils, Sharpies or Crayons in at least 4 colors for each student.

To decorate your Easter Egg, you are going to scribble in a rounded way. The first 6 steps are practice for making all the shapes in this lesson.

Practice tracing with pencil, following the arrows on the curvy shape at the left bottom side of page 2 at least 3 times.

Practice tracing, following the arrows on the Loopy shape at the right bottom side of page 2 at least 3 times.

Practice tracing the Curvy, Loopy Lines at the top of page 2- See how far you can get without the arrows. Trace it as many times as you'd like.

On a practice piece of paper with pencil, make your own Curvy, Loopy drawings. Trace them with black sharpie. (extra practice) Hint: Don't try to draw too fast.

On another practice piece of paper try to draw Egg Shapes in pencil using the 3 steps on page 3. Make as many eggs as you can in different sizes.

Use sharpie to trace any that you think you drew really well. (extra practice)

With pencil, draw a very large egg on a new piece of paper. Use an eraser to fix any parts that don't look right.

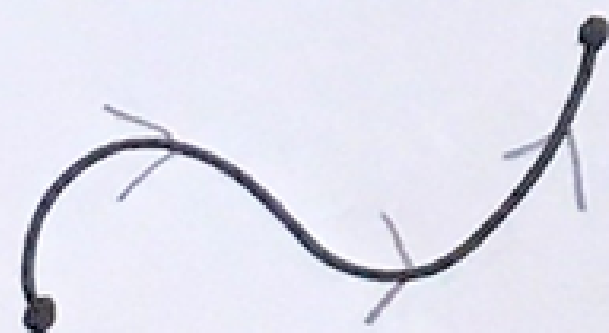
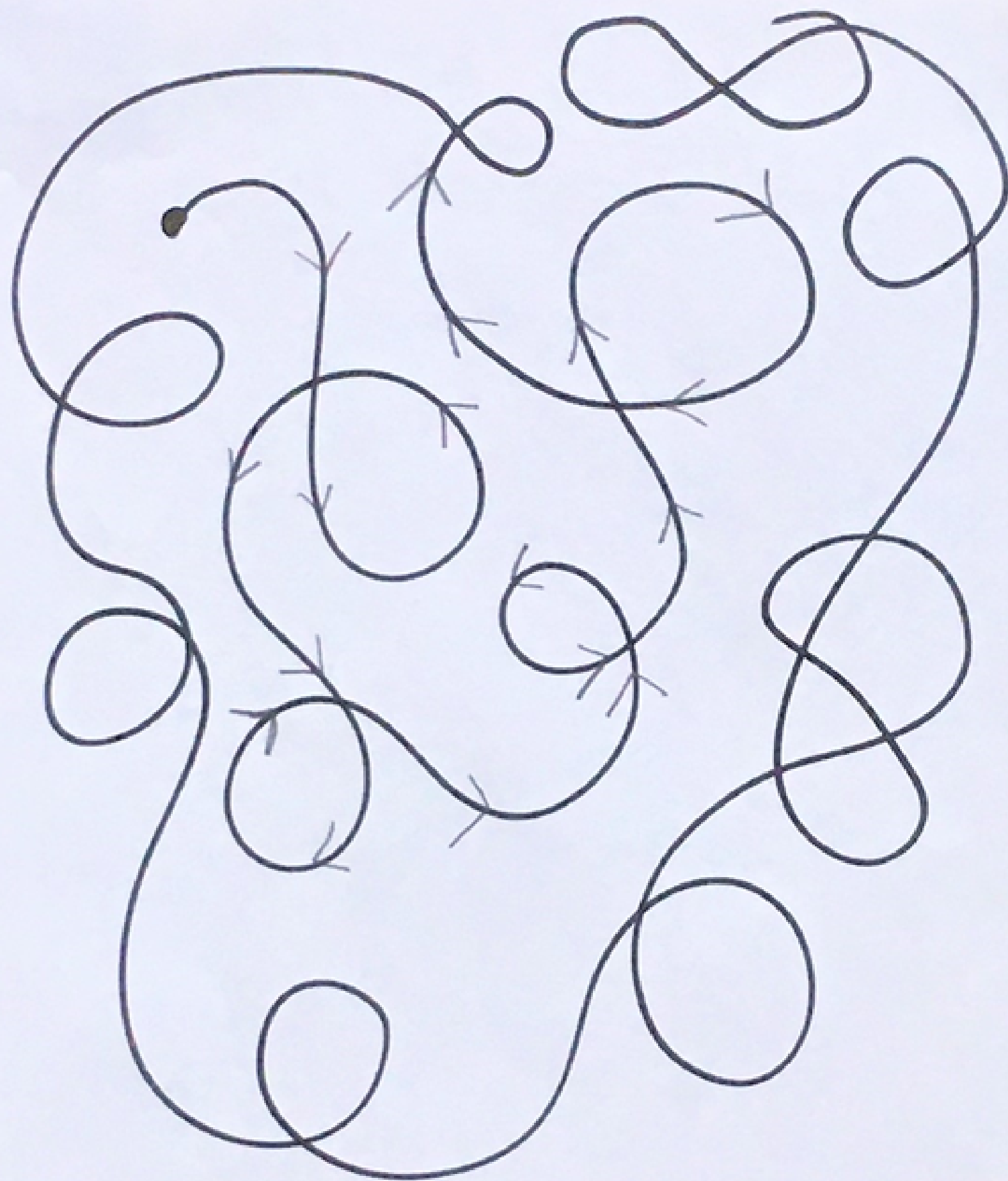
When you think you have done your best, trace it with black sharpie.

Egg shapes can take practice to draw. If you just can't draw it yet, print out page 4 and continue following the directions.

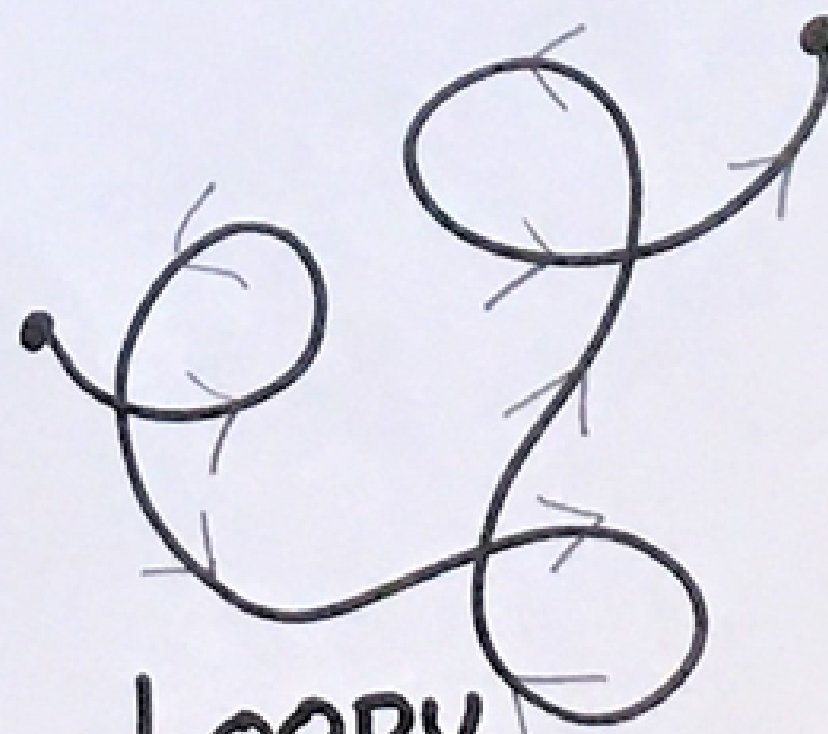
Now you can fill your egg with curvy, loopy lines. It is okay if they overlap a little. You are creating spaces you can color in with lots of different colors. Just keep your lines inside the Egg shape.

You can now make Easter Cards or Eggs for your family and friends!





Curvy

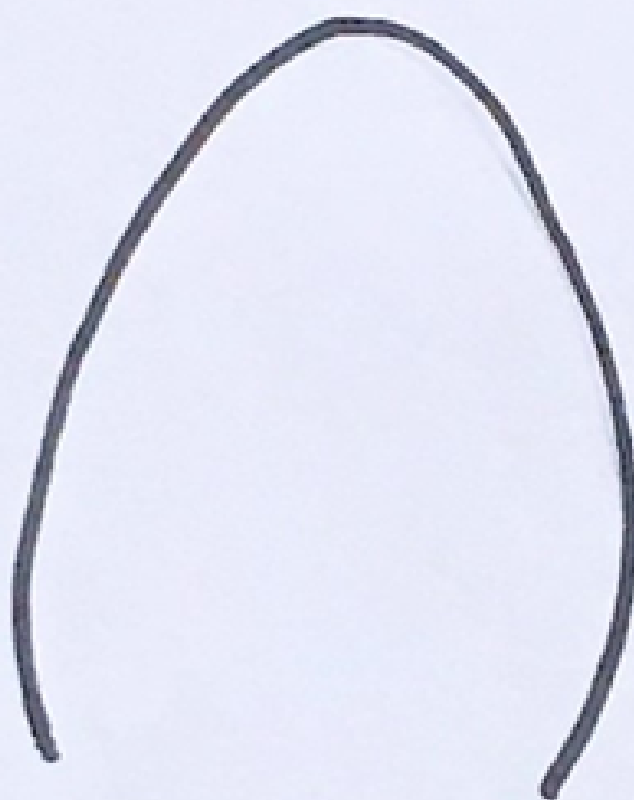


Loopy
