

How OWL You? – Grades 1-4

Supplies: White paper, printer, colored paper (1 per student) colored pencils, markers or crayons, glue stick.

Start by showing your students this short video about Owls: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=m0XgSrdYQRY>

1- Print a copy of page 2 for each student.

2- Start with the eyes. Pass out yellow crayons or markers and ask the students: **“What color are most owls’ eyes?”** Yellow

3- Pass out black crayons or markers and have them color the center circle black saying- **“This is the large pupil that helps owls to see at night.”**

4- Ask them - **“Why can an owl turn his head almost all the way around?”**

Answer: The owl’s eyes cannot move in the sockets like ours and many other animals

5- Have the students create a different design in each space of the owl with a black marker, dark pencil or dark crayon. **(except for the eyes)**

(See examples of simple fill patterns on page 3 and placement on the Owl on page 4)

6- Pass out more colors to your students so they can color in their designs – **see example on page 5**

You can talk more about what they learned watching the video while they color.
