Artist Trading Cards - Grades K-6









A.T.C. (Artist Trading Cards)

Artist Trading Cards are a fascinating pastime for a great number of professional artists. The cards are made on any surface and are always 2-1/2" x 3-1/2", a size that fits into standard baseball card storage sleeves. Each child must make at least six cards, each in a different design and made using a variety of art materials.

Process

- Use the printed side of the card for the art work. Paint directly with tempera for a background. Use more than one color or mix paint with the Crayola[®] texture mediums. Use the Stancups[®] for mixing and sharing with all students.
- Continue to add cut shapes, yarn and more to all six cards.
- On the reverse side of the art add a label with artists' statistics. Include:

HINT: Trading can be organized by placing designs face up on a table. Children take turns choosing the same number of cards that they contributed.
