

Musical Board Game - All Grades

SUPPLES

- You will need tape, dots, or paper
- You will need to make dice with musical notes (the notes that I used were quarter note 1, half note 2, dotted half note 3, whole note 4, rest, skip a turn, and a whole note plus a quarter note.
- Optional arrows to direct children across board.

INSTRUCTIONS

Make a path for the students to follow using plastic dots, paper, or tape with a start and finish.

Then, line the students up (the game is usually best played in groups of 2, 4 or 6). Then give the first student the dice to roll and whatever musical note they get is how many times they get to move across the board. For example, if they roll a quarter note they get to move one space. This is because a quarter note equals 1 beat. Whoever gets to the finish first wins the game. This game is great for students to learn their note names along with how to count them.
