
Making Art with Curvy and Zig Zaggy Lines Grades K-12

Supplies: Pencil, Colored Pencils, Sharpies or Crayons, 2-3 pieces of white computer paper, a ruler or straight edge, and scissors.


- 1- Take a look at the examples below. These examples are of curvy shapes and lines. There are probably 100's more you can find online but this gives you a good start.
- 2- You can trace the lines from these examples to learn how to make them.

Curvy Lines




Notice that the lines curve and can be thin, or thick. Have fun practicing curvy lines.


Zig Zags



- 3- These lines have sharp turns, sometimes called Zig Zags.
- 4- Move your pencil or pen straight in one direction then stop (making a point) and turn quickly in another direction with a straight line. Repeat, repeat. Basic V shape.
- 5- Again the lines can be thick or thin.

Other Types of Lines





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When you have finished practicing all the different kinds of lines:

- 1- Prepare a second piece of paper by dividing it into 4 sections (fold in half in both directions)
- 2- With your ruler and a sharpie, draw a line on each fold dividing your paper into 4 boxes.
- 3- With a sharpie, fill each section with one of the types of lines you like best. You can overlap the lines this will create interesting spaces to color in or keep them separated. Have fun, there really is no wrong way to do this!
- 4- If you choose about 4-5 colors and color each section with some of the same colors they will look nice together in a project. See examples below.
- 5- You do not have to color every space. In fact, you will get nice contrast between your designs if you leave some white in the design.
- 6- When you have finished, use your scissors to cut out the four sections by cutting the paper where it was folded.
- 7- Save this paper and come back to learn more ways to create art paper and what you can make with it.
